


# Special Olympics Founder to be Honored at 2017 ESPYS

She will also be working closely with SOIA <u>Global</u> <u>Messengers</u>, helping them write speeches and be leaders in the community.

Olinger is excited to join the SOIA staff. "I want to broaden my scope of working with kids and adults from all across the state

and encourage individuals to become athletes and participate in any sports that they are capable of participating in," she says. Olinger's favorite part about Special Olympics is seeing how passionate athletes are about competing at an event.
