

## Starting October 1: SOIA to Roll Out New Release and Medical Forms

Starting **October 1, 2017** Special Olympics will require all athletes joining Special Olympics lowa to complete newly updated <u>SOIA Release and Medical Forms</u>.

These new forms will take the place of the Physical and Consent Forms that SOIA required athletes to fill out in the past. Any athlete with a current Physical and Consent Form on file will NOT need to renew with the new forms until their current physical expires.

Before athletes can begin competition in SOIA, they must submit the following forms:

- Athlete Information Form (renewed every 3 years)
- Participant Release Form
- Medical Forms
  - Health History
  - Physical Exam (renewed every 3 years)
  - Referral Form (if required)

Although Bowling does not belong to the Olympic sports, it is among the most popular sports in Special Olympics. It is a particularly beneficial sport to people with intellectual disabilities, regardless of their age or sports abilities, since it ensures physical exercise and at the same time participation and social integration. Plus, it's great fun! An athlete may participate in one of the following events (ramp bowling is available):

- Singles
- Doubles



- Team (four-person)
- Unified Doubles (one SOIA athlete with one Unified partner)
- Unified Team (two SOIA athletes with two Unified partners)

## **Team Helps Victims of Hurricane Harvey**

When Hurricane Harvey hit last month Alicia Porter knew she couldn't sit on the sidelines and watch. The Special Olympics Iowa coach had an important connection to Houston; her assistant coach, Barb Hottman is originally from the city.

Hottman, a former special education teacher from Houston has a daughter living in Houston and she immediately wanted to go and see firsthand how her and all of her friends were really doing.

"Through phone calls we began to realize that these people were living on cans of soup and even Krations. We knew that she [Hottman] could not go empty-handed," Porter said. Team Porter began reaching out to close friends and relatives, asking for donations of food and paper supplies. With an outpouring of support, a thousand dollars worth of food and supplies were donated and sent with Hottman to bring to Houston. Porter learned that Texas residence were waiting in line for hours at grocery stores only to be turned away. Meat, milk, eggs and bread were impossible to get. "What a blessing when we were able to share our lowa wealth" says Porter. "We were able to help 12 very needy families in Houston. They were so humbled and so appreciative.
