Sammons Partnership Brings Coach into the SOIA Softball Family

The Special Olympics Iowa State Softball Tournament has been sponsored by Sammons Financial Group since 2010. The company not only donates money to keep the event going, but lines the softball fields with volunteers each summer.

One of those volunteers loved the event so much, he became a coach for one of the Link Associates team. Rick King is a

process improvement consultant for Sammons and has coached softball and baseball for 15 years.

"I coached baseball teams back in Boston with adults and with Special Olympics, so I decided to jump in here," King explained. "It's been great."

All together, he has spent seven years as a Special Olympics coach — two with SOIA and five with Special Olympics in Boston.

King likes to help mix things up at practices, making sure the 30 or more athletes he sees on the field get the training they need to improve their skills. They conduct drills with the help of the Link staff in hitting, fielding and other key elements of the game.

"We push them to the edge of their comfort zone," said King. "These athletes are quite inspirational. They're always willing to take on more and give it their all."

What King enjoys most is something the staff at Special Olympics Iowa hear often ... he gets more out of the experience than he gives.

"My favorite thing is seeing how happy the athletes get," King explains. "They are able to enjoy them-

"It made me very proud to represent Special Olympics," said Rolek. "I got to use skills I learned in Special Olympics such as how to interview and be comfortable with new people. It was great to be on the golf course and play as well as the other men. Special Olympics gave me the confidence and practice."



State Equestrian Meet at Jester Park Sept. 26

Athletes from across the state will compete in events including horsemanship, egg and spoon, barrel race, ball drop, key hole race, pole bending and baton relay. Balance, stability and the right communication between the horse and the rider are key elements for success.

"I have worked with a horse named Lakota at the Cedar Falls Equestrian Center for many years," said Craun. "This year was my first year with a horse named Dude. His owner (Allie Allspach) is really nice for letting me work with him."

Craun also trains with the Aspire Therapeutic Riding Prigram, where she competes tasks such as delivering mail on horseback. The training has helped her in competitions like Special Olympics and the Blackhawk County 4H Fair.

The Opening Ceremony will begin at 9:30 a.m. with competition beginning at 10 a.m. The event is free and open to the public. We encourage everyone to come out and cheer on our athletes.

Arnold Begins Vice President Role at SOIA




John Arnold has been named the vice president of program services and athlete experiences for Special Olympics Iowa. He began his new role in August.
