## Director of Sports & Advanced Competitions Report for the 11/14/2018 Board of Director Meeting

**Volleyball:** The 2018 SOIA Volleyball Tournament was held on October 6 at Iowa State University in Ames. 31 teams from across Iowa participated in the one day tournament.
